Corduroy's Visit

Materials needed:

*Corduroy Bear or any stuffed bear - www.bearseverywhere.com *Box or travel bag for Corduroy's "house"

*Letters from Lisa

*Journal or notebook for journaling

- * "Corduroy" book For example: "Corduroy Goes to the Doctor."
 - 1. A letter and box is received in the school office from Lisa. Lisa is going on a trip and bears are not invited. Lisa would like the class to care for Corduroy in her absence.
 - 2. Director, principal, or office staff either knocks on the classroom door and delivers the box and letter or makes an announcement over the intercom. "Kindly send two classroom helpers to the office to pick up a package that has been delivered for your class."
 - 3. Read the letter to the class. Discuss Lisa's request and problem solve the care for Corduroy, encouraging the children to take turns inviting Corduroy to visit their homes for one night.
 - 4. Provide a journal for the children to take home so that they can write about Corduroy's visit. A "Corduroy" storybook needs to be included for a good night story.
 - 5. After the last child has had a turn to take Corduroy home, a letter is received in the school office. Lisa has returned and plans to have a taxi stop by the school the next day to pick up Corduroy.
 - The children are invited to bring their favorite bear to school for a farewell party with Corduroy. Special treats for the "Teddy Bear Picnic" culminate this activity. Parent helpers are encouraged.
 - 7. Towards the end of the picnic, a parent helper keeps watch outside for the taxi. When sighted, she/he announces to the class that the taxi has arrived. The children all go outside and wave good-bye to Corduroy. All sing the class "good-bye" song.
